## CONSTITUTION

- 1. The name of the Society is "100 MILE HOUSE AND DISTRICT SOCCER ASSOCIATION".
- The purpose of the Society is:
  - To organize and promote soccer in the District of 100 Mile House and the surrounding area.
  - b) To establish teams and leagues at a cost which is universally affordable.
  - c) To endeavor to deliver a good quality program comparable to or exceeding similar programs in British Columbia.
  - d) To strive for the highest standards of fair play, sportsmanship, and skill in a positive, funfilled playing environment for players, coaches and parents.
  - e) To develop and train referees and coaches to assist in the delivery of a quality soccer program.
  - f) To liaise with the British Columbia Soccer Association (BCSA).
  - g) To support provincial youth soccer programs by increased participation on provincial soccer teams and within their organizing committees.
- The district shall include the town of 100 Mile House and the communities and immediate region surround 100 Mile House known as the District of 100 Mile House. <u>This clause shall</u> <u>be alterable</u>.
- 4. The 100 Mile House and District Soccer Association shall be an affiliate of the British Columbia Soccer Association (BCSA) and subject to the rules and regulations of that body and of the Canadian Soccer Association. <u>This clause shall be alterable.</u>
- 5. Upon wind-up or dissolution of the Society, the assets remaining after the payment of all costs, charges and expenses properly incurred in the wind-up, including the remuneration of a liquidator, and after payment to employees of the Society of any arrears of salaries or wages, and after payment of any other debts of the Society, shall be distributed to a recognized charitable organization (or organizations) in the 100 Mile House district with similar objectives, or another suitable sports association in the Province of British Columbia, registered under the provision of the Income Tax Act, which shall be designated by the Board of Directors. This clause shall be unalterable.
